Please bring with you all the documents that have anything to do with your asylum application, your residency or the reasons you were forced to leave your home country. If you have them, please also bring any certificates, appointment slips etc. from doctors and hospitals.

If you cannot speak English or German very well, please bring along someone who can interpret for you.

Telephone consultations are held every Monday from 10 am to 2 pm.

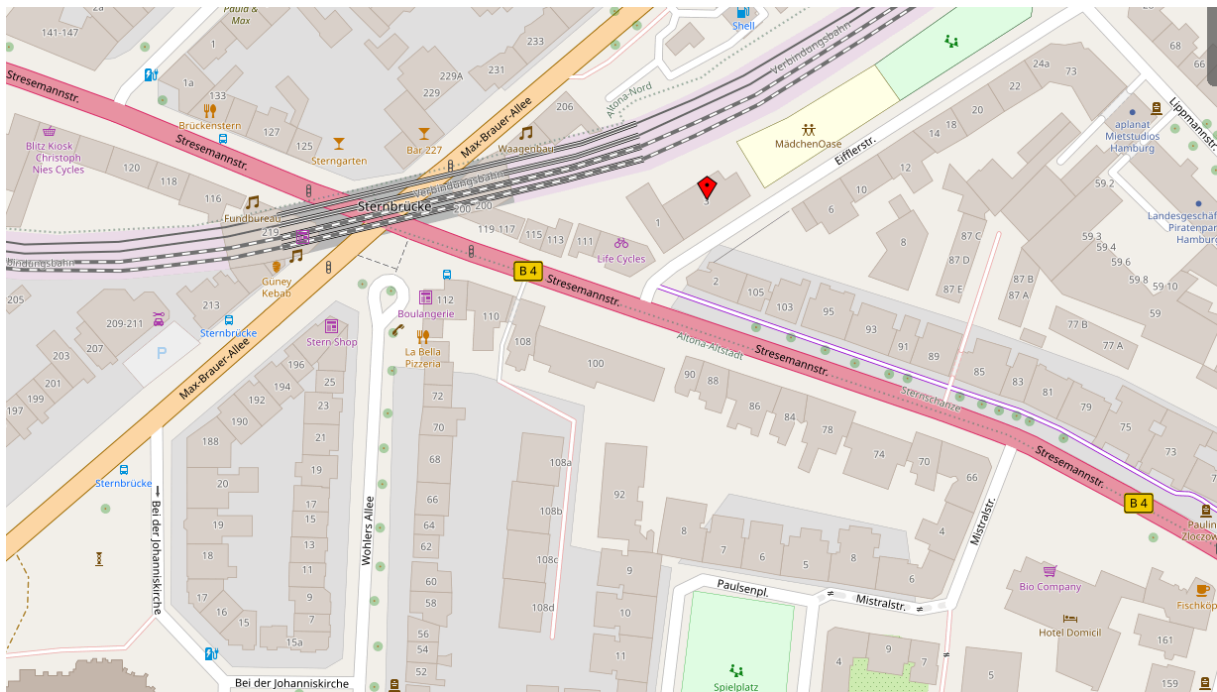
If you have any questions concerning social welfare law problems, such as social security benefits, looking for somewhere to live, therapy places or work permits etc., please contact a Social Advice Centre or the Public Legal Information Centre, which is called the ÖRA.

If you already hold a residence permit and have any questions about visitor visas or family reunification, please contact a lawyer, the district integration centres, the Public Legal Information Centre or another advice centre.
