Please also bring any medical certificates, appointment slips or business cards from the doctors / hospitals that may be treating you, as well as any vocational certificates and wage statements you might have.

If you are not comfortable speaking in English or German, please bring someone with you to translate.

We also offer telephone consultations every Monday from 10 am to 12 pm.

If you have any questions about social issues (e.g. welfare benefits, looking for somewhere to live, therapy, work permits), please contact a welfare counselling centre or the Public Legal Information and Arbitration Office in Hamburg (ÖRA).

If you already have a residence permit and would like to find out more about visitor visas or family reunification measures, please contact a lawyer, a district integration centre, the ÖRA, the GRC Tracing Service or another information centre.
